How to make slime Zeinab E (2W)

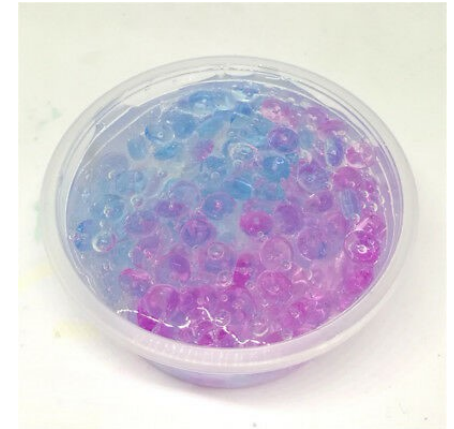
Ingredients
